Communication and Language

The children will understand the importance of good listening They will be involved in daily story time and small chatter time groups. It is very important to talk with your child and be involved in their play at home. This encourages new vocabulary. They will be making predictions of stories and discussing different characters and settings.

During the second half term our Topic is: What's in the Woods?

Date of any trip: Thorndon Park -The Gruffalo Trail - 16th November 2022

English

Children will extend their learning through the story 'The Gruffalo'." They will join in and retell the story. We will also learn the Three Billy Goats Gruff" story, using actions for prompts. We will continue to develop their phonic knowledge through Monster Phonics and they will practice blending sounds to read. The children will be learning how to form the letters so they can write simple words and sentences.

Personal and Social

The children will be learning about emotions and identifying their own feelings socially and emotionally. We will discuss different emotions and how they can affect our mood and behaviour. We will be developing friendships and knowing why we need rules.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

The children will be learning about different faiths and how people celebrate Christmas around the world. We will also be noticing the changing of the seasons. We will continue to look at weather patterns and seasonal changes when we visit the woods. We will be encouraging the children to look at similarities and differences between past and present.

Maths

Children will continue to develop their knowledge of numbers. Throughout the term we will be learning numbers one to five. We will be using numicon and number blocks. The children will be introduced to different shapes and will name and describe simple 2D shapes. They will be introduced to 1 more and 1 less using numcion, counters, cubes and a number line.

Physical

The children will be talking about keeping healthy and overall health and well-being including why it is important to get plenty of sleep. We will be practising and refining ball skills and learning new games in PE. The children will also be developing different ways to travel. To develop fine motor skills, we will be drawing lines, circles, and shapes to create pictures.

Expressive Arts

The children will be learning new songs and rhymes to perform for an audience. They will be making Christmas decorations using collage, painting and modelling. In music they will be experimenting making different sounds using a variety of instruments.

Communication and Language

The children will be engaged in story times across the day. They will take part in Chatter time discussions (small group discussions), topic related chats and issues which arise in class. We will be able to listen carefully and we will be developing the understanding of how and why questions.

We are encouraging the children to become more independent by following the 5Rs of readiness, resilience, resourcefulness, responsibility and reflectiveness, so please remind your child that it is their responsibility to be ready for school and hand in their reading records.
