Accommodation

- Girl only/boy only chalets
- Up to 6 in a chalet.
- Beds/bunk beds
- Chalets close together in our own group
- Teacher chalets next to/opposite children's
- Chalets have showers and toilets
- Have to be kept tidy by children and will be inspected





Accommodation

- o Children will make own beds!
- Keys will be children's responsibility lost keys will have to be paid for among the cabin - £5
- Children will select 3 people they would like to share with once we know the size of the cabins, they will be guaranteed to be with at least one person they have selected. If there are any children who you would not like your child to share with, please contact Miss James by Tuesday 19th September.
- Won't find out who they're sharing with until arrival

Security/Safety

- Closed site perimeter fenced
- o Gate control 24 hour
- Site patrol throughout night
- Duty instructors until 10.00 pm
- Children are the teachers' responsibility in any down time
- Teachers' chalets clearly marked if problem at night, children will know exactly where to find us
- Instructor responsible for leading all activities
- Orientation on arrival for children and teachers/strict safety talk and tour - shown meeting points and fire assembly points on arrival

Security/Safety

- All activities are strictly Risk Assessed
- All instructors qualified and trained to the national standards for the activities undertaken
- Careful nurturing approach taken supportive, patient and encouraging staff
- Each activity assessed and log completed
- Logs held centrally in reception

Meals



- Wide choice, including vegetarian options
- Allocated seats and meal times
- Breakfast cooked, toast, cereal, fruit
- Bread and fruit always available at lunch and dinner
- Encouraged to try foods they may not have had at home!

Typical Activities

- High wire activities, climbing, zip wire, abseiling, archery, team games, problem solving......
- There will be a mixture of individual and team building activities
- Won't know exact activities until nearer departure

- 7.30 am Allowed out of chalets
- 8.00 Breakfast
- o 9.00 am Activity One Zip Wire
- o 11.00 am Activity Two Low Ropes
- 1.00 pm Lunch
- o 2.00 pm Activity Three Aeroball
- 4.00 pm Activity Four Climbing
- o 6.30 pm Dinner
- 7.00 pm Diaries/quiet activities
- 7.30 pm Evening activities
- 9.30 pm Into chalets
- 10.00pm Lights out
- At some point during the day, the children will have access to the gift shop.


Day of Return
