
EYFS Weekly Learning Update Week Beginning 20.11.23


On Monday we started to rehearse for our Christmas Performance, we can't wait for you to come and see it. It's beginning to get very festive in EYFS!






We have practised counting on and back from 10 and singing songs involving counting forwards and backwards.

EYFS Weekly Learning Update Week Beginning 20.11.23

This week in music we have been continuing to find the pulse of the music. We do this by clapping, tapping and marching in time to it. We did this through the song Ring a ring a roses and experimented with pitch, using high and low voices. Our piece of music this week has been 'Don't Go Breaking My Heart' by Elton John, we all enjoyed dancing and putting our own moves to it!

In the creative area we started to paint Diva Lamps we made last week. We noticed how the clay has changed now it is dry, from soft and squishy, to hard and solid. We followed our designs so we knew what colour paint and glitter we needed.









We have also made some salt dough decorations for our school hall. We talked about how the dough was soft and mouldable like the clay and predicted how we thought it might change as it dried out. Look out for them when you come in for the concert.

Our new phonemes are f ff | | | ss and we have been learning HFW's: he, she, me, we, be, of.

At home this week you could carry on learning by:

Practicing using the phonemes s a t p i n m d g o c k c k e u r h b j w x y, f, ff, l, ll and s. You can make words using these phonemes and practice blending to read them and segmenting to spell them e.g. fox, leg, yum and huff.

Read the Monster Phonic Book that has been sent home to practice blending at least three times. Please record each read in your child's the yellow reading record book.
