General Information:

This term, children will be preparing for their National Multiplication Check which will be completed in the first two weeks of June. Please ensure they continue to practice their tables daily at home. We have booked a trip to Rainham Marshes on Friday 7^{th} June.

PE:

Please ensure your child's uniform and PE kit are clearly named. On your child's PE day, please ensure that earnings are removed for Health and Safety reasons or the children have tape in school. Please ensure this is black shorts and jogging bottoms, white t-shirt or polo shirt and a black jacket or jumper.

PE for each class will be on a Tuesday. Swimming will continue on alternate Wednesdays until July.

Homework:

- Reading This needs to be done daily for fifteen to twenty minutes and recorded in the reading diaries.
- Times tables These should be practiced on a daily basis using Times Table Rock Stars for a minimum of thirty minutes a week.
- Spellings Children will be given spellings to learn each week, these will be stuck into their reading records. A spelling activity can be accessed from a Friday via Spelling Shed to help them learn their spellings. Spellings should be learnt for the test the following Friday.

Enalish

We will explore the book 'Varmints' and children will be given opportunities to describe flowers, write letters and make speeches to a secret society of gardeners who plan to change the world through the power of nature. This series of lessons culminates in children writing an explanation text about the life cycle of a plant with a clear structure. Following on from this, we will look at Jabberwocky by Lewis Carroll where children will use the language of the poem to investigate and explore their knowledge of etymology and morphology, before performing the poem and eventually creating their own nonsense verse with a gruesome creature based on the same structure.

Ma	ths
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We will be looking at shape, presenting data in different forms and investigating position and direction.

Art

We will explore how shapes and negative spaces can be represented by three dimensional forms. Manipulating a range of materials, children will learn ways to join and create free-standing structures inspired by the work of Anthony

Caro.

Computing

Pupils will use computational thinking to solve problems using the areas of abstractions, algorithm, design, decomposition and pattern recognition

P.E.

We will develop our swimming and athletics skills.

Science

We will be identifying animals using classification keys, also understanding the difference between vertebrate and invertebrates.

Geography

Children will look at the distribution of the world's biomes and mapping food imports from around the world, they will learn about trading fairly with a specific focus on Côte d'Ivoire and cocoa beans. They will explore where the food for their school dinners comes from and the pros and cons of local versus global.

PSHE

Children will study the question, 'What is important to me?' using this to help understand how everybody is different.

Music

Children will learn to play 'The Blue Danube' by Strauss on the keyboards.

We will continue learning how to: name rooms in the house, describe rooms in the house, say what people do at home, say what people do and wear.
